
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NILOA February 2022 Newsletter

DQP Corner 3.0



If you haven't already, we invite you to view the revised **Degree Qualifications Profile (DQP) 3.0** released in December 2021. To accompany this release, we offer up supplemental resources that supported this revision process.

For those new to the DQP (or a reminder for those more familiar with it), the DQP is a learning-centered framework for what college graduates should know and be able to do to earn the associate's, bachelor's and/or master's degree(s). Since its official release ten years ago and

its second revision in 2014, this updated DQP reflects current conversations in the field and resulted in a third release!

We've developed a few tools since its initial release and created a few more in this third iteration to support DQP implementation. Those resources for our February 2022 edition include:

- A blog written by Dr. Marilee Bresiciani Ludvik on <u>the DQP</u>, <u>Transference of Knowledge, and the Importance of Reflection</u> <u>Amidst the Pandemic</u>;
- 2. A <u>NILOA Report</u> on its review of existing Institution-Level Learning Outcomes (ILOs) in relation to the DQP; and
- 3. A <u>case study featuring National Louis University</u> and its use of the DQP to develop new programs as well as curricular pathways that include a focus upon differentiated levels of learning.


We hope these resources assist in furthering DQP work happening at your institution.

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NILOA April 2022 Newsletter


Colleagues,
